Items not on the agenda

We have an arborist advising on trees in the southeast corner of the Meadows, alongside the river, and at the end of Stile Close. Once more information is available this will be added to the agenda for consideration.

The council agreed to apply for the Parish Partnership Scheme grant to contribute towards a feasibility study on the traffic on the south and east side of the Common. The application requires the support of County Councillor Daniel Elmer. We are awaiting his confirmation before completing the grant application.

Puddleducks are having some work carried out in the nursery garden. They will be arranging for a skip to be placed in the village hall car park.

Puddleducks have also reported that some of the fortnightly grass cuts have been missed, and equipment has not been moved before the cut. This has resulted in the children being unable to use the garden. We have discussed this with the contractor and hope we have found a solution. The 2026 grounds maintenance contract template has been amended and is ready for the council to approve.

There has been misunderstanding, between the council, Blakey's Bus and the village hall management committee, about the use of the village hall toilets. The management, including use and hiring, of these toilets is the responsibility of the management committee. If you have any queries, please contact the management committee.

South Norfolk Council are replacing the knee rail fencing along Cuckoofield Lane. This work is currently ongoing. Many thanks to South Norfolk Council for their support.

We have been in contact with Saffron Housing and Mulbarton Environmental Group about the maintenance of the triangle on the junction of Catmere Herne and Cuckoofield Lane. We hope that improvements will soon be made.

The council have appointed Smiths of Derby to maintain the church clock. The next routine check is scheduled to take place on 23 October.

Item 5: Co-option applications

Mulbarton Parish Council has 11 seats but currently only has 5 councillors. We have received 2 applications for consideration but this still leaves us with 4 spaces. The Parish Councillor role is a voluntary role and if you would like to get involved or find out more, please get in touch.

Item 8.8: 2026/27 budget

Most of the council's income comes from the precept, which is collected from our residents by South Norfolk Council as part of the council tax bill. The deadline for the budget is set by South Norfolk Council. This date has not been agreed yet, but it is usually in early January. Councillors must consider the requirements of the council to determine precept required for 2026/27.
