Budget 2026/27

We appreciate all residents who attended our January meeting and took the time to learn about the council's budget process and the challenges we face. Although the meeting was lengthy, your input was truly valued.

Following detailed discussions, the council set the 2026/27 expenditure at £346,386, with a precept of £158,547. The remaining £187,839 will come from grants, reserves, and other sources. For a band D property, this means the parish council's increase amounts to £17 per year.

In January, Dennis Wells stepped down as parish councillor. Since joining in 2023, Dennis contributed to various council projects and regular on-going maintenance, including play areas, allotments, SAM2 signs, internal controls, software implementation, and footpaths.
